Person who “stayed” shares suggestions gained from other participants.

Persons who “strayed” add any related suggestions they may have heard at the other tables.

Brainstorm as a group the final list of suggestions you wish to talk more about in the future.

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	Consensus Building	<p>Lack of Cohesiveness of Leadership Team Leadership team does not have a clearly defined role and/or there are not common beliefs among leadership team members.</p>	
	Consensus Building	<p>Lack of Buy-In From the Staff Leadership team is very committed, but their enthusiasm is not shared broadly across the school staff</p>	
	Consensus Building	<p>Staff Turnover New teachers and new administrators are hired and do not have the beliefs consistent with framework</p>	
	Consensus Building	<p>Lack of Support from Central Administration and/or Community Practices being implemented are being questioned by outside stakeholders. This questioning undermines teacher confidence in implementation or may include actual barriers.</p>	
	Consensus Building	<p>Teachers Find it Too Complex Teachers are supportive, but indicate through their questions and their concerns that the complexity of the framework is overwhelming.</p>
